

On August 1st Shana Krivonak posted a picture of dead sheepshead on the beach at Shade's Beach. This scene was repeated on beaches surrounding Lake Erie. After several days of cold North winds, the upper water layer cooled from 80 to 72 degrees, causing the upper layer to drop down, forming areas of depleted oxygen, and therefore killing the fish.

PFBC BOARD MEETS – STEELHEAD ANGLERS, HEAR THIS

At their July meeting the PFBC Board voted to give final approval to a change to special regulations applicable to Lake Erie tributary streams. Under this change, the permitted hours for angler access and fishing on Walnut Creek from Route 5 downstream to the Manchester Road Bridge will be limited to one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset. Walnut Creek from Manchester Road Bridge downstream to Lake Erie and Elk Creek north of Route 5 will maintain no time restrictions for fishing. This amendment will go into effect upon publication of a second notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

On other business

The Board voted to consent to the acquisition of a property easement in Girard Township, Erie County. Under the proposed agreement, the PFBC will pay \$170,000 to MJS Improvements for approximately 7.52 acres, which includes 410 feet of stream footage along one side of Elk Creek, and 125 feet along the other side. The PFBC owns fishing easements along the creek in this area, although it does not have sufficient access for parking. The PFBC plans to remove all structures on the parcel and intends to develop additional parking on the site. Public access to Elk Creek will be significantly increased with the addition of this parcel, as anglers will be better able to access the easement corridor.

Board Elects New Officers

The Board elected John Mahn, Jr., of Charleroi, Washington County, as President. Mahn, who serves as District 2 Commissioner and is the outgoing Vice President, replaces Daniel Pastore of Fairview, Erie County, as President.

VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION PICNIC WAS HELD AUGUST 4TH



EAST DOBBINS LANDING DOCK WALL REPAIRED

As part of the Erie Western PA Port Authorities efforts to improve its property the south wall of the east arm of Dobbins Landing (Public Dock) is undergoing the installation of new sheet piling. Hopefully the project will make this real estate more attractive to potential developers. We can only hope that a much needed bait shop or boat supply and repair shop or other maritime businesses will be part of the development.



BLUE WALLEYE CAUGHT

On July 29, Craig Tolnay emailed the photo of a blue colored walleye he caught thinking it might be a blue

pike. Extensive research was conducted on blue pike in the 1990's in order to possibly find some blue pike still alive. It was reported in the *Bucket* last month another fish, the cisco now gone from Lake Erie was found existing



in Crystal Lake in Eastern Pennsylvania. The Erie Hatchery would send eggs to other parts of the country as in the case of the cisco, and blue pike were among these shipments. The studies conducted by fisheries biologists concluded that blue pike were nothing but a blue colored walleye. That is the current belief.

I forwarded the email to PFBC Lake Erie Unit biologist Mark Haffley who replied that it was probably the case with this fish.
