SECTION OF LAKE ONTARIO DESIGNATED AS A MARINE SANCTUARY

Lake Ontario has received a new designation and with it added protections and emphasis on its historic and cultural resources.

The Lake Ontario National Marine Sanctuary was announced June 5 during the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation's Capitol Hill Ocean Week. It's the 16th such designation overall and the third in the Great Lakes.

The protected area, which encompasses 1,722 square miles of eastern Lake Ontario, will border Wayne, Cayuga, Oswego, and Jefferson counties. The sanctuary encompasses 41 known shipwrecks and one aircraft, though historical records indicate an additional 19 shipwrecks, three aircraft, and several underwater archaeological sites could be found there, too. It will be comanaged by NOAA and New York State. The Pennsylvania waters of Lake Erie is now under consideration for the same designation. Maybe we're next.







ERIE NAMED BEST FISHING TOWN IN PA

The following story by Drew Miller was posted on July 10, 2024

(WJET/WFXP) – One of the leading sites for booking fishing trips across the country recently named Erie as the best spot for fishing in Pennsylvania, with three other surrounding towns also making the top 10.

A study recently done by *FishingBooker* sought to find the best place to take a fishing trip in each state using six criteria from their internal data, with each worth a maximum of 10 points. The criteria used included the number of available fishing charters, average review score, average recommended score, number of guides with the Angler's Choice Award, number of bookings, and minimum price of a fishing trip. Erie finished with a score of 50 out of 60, tying with New Orleans, of all places, with only 22 cities receiving a higher score. In addition to Erie, Erie County, Fairview, West Springfield, and Lake City were included in the results.

These facts are not new, too. In the early 1920's Erie was designated as the "Freshwater Fishing Capital of the World" because of the great commercial fishing industry that was present at that time.

On January 25, 2012, the State House Of Representatives passed a resolution naming "Erie County, the Freshwater Fishing Capital of Pennsylvania" The resolution was introduced by Rep John Hornamen and was unanimously approved by the State Legislature.

The "Freshwater Fishing Capital of Pennsylvania" designation is extremely important to us. It not only recognizes the great fishery of Erie County but it calls attention to the great economic potential that the sportfishing industry offers. It also recognizes the huge efforts made by clubs like ours, the PA Fish and Boat Commission and other state agencies who have worked hard to improve our fishery. We were so proud we even put that on the back of our T shirts.



VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION PICNIC

Captain Pete Alex and Team Vision Quest took back-to-back titles with the victory after a 2 day score of 404.60.



SUDDEN WATER TEMPERATURE CHANGE CAUSES FISH KILL

Strong cool north winds caused the Lake to "turn over". Lake turnover is the process by which a body of water renews itself. It occurs when the warmer, lighter water at the surface of the lake cools from the cool winds and mixes with the colder, denser water at the bottom. This process is known as convection, and it happens in all lakes on a regular basis. The change causes fish kills among certain species that cannot quickly adapt to the temperature change. Dead fish were found at Beach 11 on Presque Isle State park, Avonia Beach in Fairview Township, and Shade's Beach. Shade's Beach had hundreds of dead fish, mostly sheepshead, washing up causing big clean up effort.



FISH KILLS CAUSED BY TEMPERATURE CHANGE ARE NOT NEW HERE

The Erie County Lighting Co. was established on East Front Street in the 1920's. This power plant drew its water from the East Canal basin on Erie's for the production of steam to power its steam turbines. The exhausted steam was discharged into the west canal basin. This warm water attracted gizzard shad (aka mooneyes) that congregated in Presque Isle Bay in the winter. Lack of oxygen and sudden temperatures resulted in tons of dead fish. The above 1953 photo shows hundreds of thousands or about 800 tons of dead mooneyes. This event occurred almost annually while the plant was in operation. It was in operation there until the 1980's.

ALLIGATORS AMONG US!

At the beginning of August, cyber space news outlets were ablaze when a story surfaced after Stina and Jacob Roach posted a video on Facebook of an alligator Stina took on August 4th as it was seen in the water off of the East Avenue boat launch.



The photo aboveis a screen grab showing what appears to to be a 3-5foot long alligator. They reported their siting to the Erie Police who contacted the Erie Western Port Authority. According to Julie Slomski, EWPPA's executive director, the area was posted with warning notices about the alligator siting and trappers were hired to locate and capture it.

Project Algerine posted this interesting tidbit on Facebook:

"Alligators in Erie!"

Back in 1887, O.T. Harrison constructed an alligator exhibit on the grounds of the Massassauga Point Hotel.

Reportedly, the collection consisted of 40 'gators. According to the June 1887 edition of the *Erie Morning Dispatch*, during feeding time on a Saturday morning, one of the medium-sized



alligators managed to escape and fled into Presque Isle Bay.

The reporter noted, "He offers a fine opportunity for any little boy or girl with chubby legs" The newspaper report concluded with a chilling scenario, suggesting that enough alligators may have escaped into Presque Isle Bay to paralyze a Sunday school picnic.
